Kidderminster Town Hall Transformation Project

I am pleased to report that good progress has been made on the project since its commencement in January this year. The majority of the ceiling repairs have been completed and painted, the audio and visual installation has commenced and tiling in the toilet areas has started. Additionally, all roof and stonework has been finished and the courtyard canopy has been put in place in preparation for the ETFE roofing (Ethylene TetrafluoroEtilene) to be installed.

The project remains on schedule for the planned completion date next summer. It's an exciting time as we watch everything come together to provide an up-to-date facility that will be future proofed for the benefit of the community.

Wyre Forest Historical Research Group Chairman Gay Hill and members of the group were involved in some of the research towards the grant application for Kidderminster Town Hall in 2019-20. We are delighted that Gay, a semi-professional historian, will be leading the historical research now needed for the implementation of the heritage project. Gay's main involvement will be to teach any newcomers how to go about researching the main sources for local history, both online and in person, and to support and mentor the research volunteers. This support is likely to include tours around Kidderminster Library's Local History Collection and possibly the Hive in Worcester and the Museum of Carpet archive. Practical training on using a microfilm reader for newspapers etc not available online will be included. A great chance to learn from our local expert!



We left the exhibition up for a week so that other visitors to Kidderminster Library and the Job Centre could view it.
